

# WHERE DO I DROP OFF AND PICK UP MY CHILD?


- AM 8:45 drop off if not arriving by bus

#### **FUNDATIONS**




- Provides all students with a foundation for reading and spelling.
- Emphasizes phonemic awareness, phonics-word study, high-frequency word study, fluency, vocabulary, handwriting and spelling.
- Whole Body Learning.
- Includes comprehension strategies.

# WHY TEACH HIGH-FREQUENCY WORDS "TRICK WORDS"?

• Trick words are phonetically irregular high frequency words that are taught as words to be memorized.

- Learning these words are beneficial to children because they appear often in text.
- The automatic recognition of these words will increase a child's reading fluency, comprehension and confidence.





#### IMPORTANCE OF SELF REGULATION


Taking turns, sharing, managing emotions

#### WITHOUT SELF REGULATION


#### WITH SELF REGULATION



Children without self-regulation may not be able to stay seated and listen to a story, sit through dinner or a game.



Children can control their attention enough to listen to a story, play a game, and sit through a meal. Their attention may wander, but they can bring it back to the task at hand.




# HOW WILL MY CHILD BE EVALUATED?

- It is helpful to have your child practice opening and closing snack containers over the summer.


# WHAT ABOUT LUNCH TIME?




